A Celebration of Grants to Local Nonprofits!

On May 9th, nearly 70 guests joined us for the 2013 Grant Award and Donor Appreciation Event. Local donors and honored grantees were joined by representatives from The Alaska Community Foundation (SCF's parent organization) and the Rasmuson Foundation for the awards ceremony. We are especially grateful to Arne and Melody Hatch, Linda Rae Olsen, and Tom Tougas for sharing their inspirational donor stories. Our sincere appreciation, as well, for the local support from the Seward Brewing Company, One-Shot Photography, the Seward Community Library, and The Breeze Inn.

Over \$44,000 was awarded to the twelve local organizations listed below through the annual grant cycle:

- <u>"He Will Provide" Food Bank</u> received \$5,000 to purchase a new commercial freezer and shelving for food storage to benefit more than 100 local residents a week who depend on their services;
- The <u>Seward Senior Center</u> was awarded \$5,000 toward the purchase of a new, more fuel-efficient van;
- A grant of \$2,692 will allow the <u>Independent Living</u> <u>Center</u> to provide a variety of outdoor activities for disabled residents;
- \$4,600 will support the Schoolyard Habitat Program, a collaboration between the <u>Resurrection Bay</u> <u>Conservation Alliance</u>, Kenai Fjords National Park, Seward Elementary School, and a host of community volunteers;

- The <u>Boys and Girls Club</u> was awarded \$3,579 for the summer DaVinci Camp, where local youth learn about science and nature through art, and for a new arts enrichment program during the school year;
- <u>Save Our Seward (SOS) Pets</u> received a \$1,500 grant to expand their spay and neuter program;
- A grant of \$5,000 will help complete the next major phase of the <u>Seward Mariners Memorial</u>;
- Volunteers from the <u>Seward Nordic Ski Club</u> will use \$4,928 to purchase equipment to improve recreational trails on the Old Sterling Highway and Trail River Campground;
- The <u>Alaska SeaLife Center</u> received \$4,000 in continued support for the Ocean Sciences Club, which benefits middle and high school students. An additional grant of \$2,000 helped the ASLC complete a new Fisheries Management exhibit;
- An award of \$4,000 will allow the <u>Seward Arts Council</u> to improve performances by equipping backstage technical crews with new communication headsets;
- The <u>Seward International Friendship Association</u> received \$2,000 to support the historic exchange program with our sister city, Obihiro, Japan.

Through your support, the Seward Community Foundation endowment now exceeds \$2.6 million! This year, investment earnings from our community "nest egg" generated more than \$56,000 for grants to local nonprofits. Remaining funds will be distributed throughout the year for "mini-grants" of up to \$500 to nonprofits.

Requests cannot exceed \$500 and must benefit the residents of the Seward and Moose Pass area. Mini-grant applications are reviewed at Advisory Board meetings - typically held the third Wednesday of every month.
